

From The Chair



I guess our holiday is a distant memory, but a good one at that. I have been really busy with club stuff since my return, but it has been very rewarding.

If you have visited the club recently you would have noticed a huge change at the hall front with the construction of a massive deck. Most members who have seen it say it is awesome. Thanks heaps to Nick L for being the construction manager. He is a machine and his skills are second to none. We started this project with the demolition of the existing deck which I did most but was completed at the working bee by others. Nick decided that the old deck did not have enough support so went into action adding extra piles and bearers. Trust me the deck is strong as. Once we got under way there were other volunteers who came during the week and weekend. Mainly thanks to Nicks' great organisation skills we had Marcel, Derek and Murray P also me of course giving a hand which was great. Others like Perry helped with cleaning up so the project was completed. John has taken away some rubbish so we are almost back to normal.

One very important announcement is that we will have an official deck warming at 4.30pm on 28th October so be there to celebrate another step forward. Drinks and nibbles provided.

For those who are interested there is over 1000 lineal meters of wide decking. Over 4000 stainless steel screws. Over 80m of 150 x 50 joists, over 80m of 100 x 50 timbers, and over 20 extra and additional piles. This is not to mention the amount of timbers that were reused for supports. This was one hell of a project. Did we manage to stick to the \$10,000 budget well not quite but were only around \$1000 over so not bad for what we got including a great seat at the end. Your club is moving forward so stay with us.

So what's coming up you may ask. Sealing of the roads and trenching for the underground power is about to commence and hopefully completed before the long weekend. So come along and enjoy your new look club. Road sealing will cost around \$36,000 and trenching around \$13,000 so yes we are spending money for the good of the club. Don't panic as Helen has a good handle on club finances closely monitored by Ross of course.

So what shall we put on the new deck. Chairs and coffee tables or what. Let us know your thoughts and donations gratefully accepted.

We have also purchased a new table tennis table which is on wheels and can also be configured for playing on your own. i.e. a back board. Anyone interested in giving us a donation for the old ones? 2 available. They will be going on Trade Me soon.

Your committee is dedicated to see your club go forward so please help where you can.

Marcel is still working on the FAL shower block extension. If you have the skills to help him let me know. We have the electrician doing lighting and plumber on board to install a new gas infinity water heating system. More work needs to be done so help if you can.

Well I think I have raved on enough so hope to see you at our roast evening on 21^{st} October and the first BBQ of this season where the committee will put on nibbles on the 22^{nd} .

Subs are now overdue

This year the committee decided to ensure that subs were collected in terms of the club's constitution, which states:-

2.4.3 In the event of a subscription remaining unpaid for three months after it becomes due, the member concerned shall be notified in writing by the Treasurer that unless payment is made within one month his membership will be considered lapsed.

2.4.4 If payment is not made within one month from the date of that letter membership will be terminated unless some alternative arrangement is agreed to by the Executive

Subs are due by 30th June each year, but this year as part of our transition the due date quoted on the invoice was 30th August. This means that by 30th September all subs should have been paid, unless instalment arrangements have made paid with the Treasurer. In those cases by 30th September 50% of the annual sub should have been paid.

The Treasurer or Membership Officer will be contacting all members who are in arrears. Please ensue your subs are paid as above. The Treasurer has a matrix to calculate the amount owing for those members who join or resign after 31st March.

If you are in doubt please contact the Treasurer. Also the club can send statements to those members who would like them, especially those who do automatic payments. If you would like an up-to-date statement, please contact Helen.

Other benefits are talking to members from other clubs and sharing ideas about social events, marketing etc.


Still not sure, come and talk to Ken and myself.
